INVITATION TO PUBLIC PRESENTATION OF PROFESSIONAL REGULATORY INSTRUMENTS BY THE HONOURABLE MINISTER OF STATE FOR ENVIRONMENT

The Council's regulatory mandate over the Environmental Health Profession includes issuance of professional standards guiding the conduct of Practitioners in the various areas in the profession. In this respect and pursuant to the Re-branding process of the profession, the Council has developed new Professional Regulatory Instruments for the enhancement of professional competence and capabilities of Environmental Health Practitioners in particular and in general, the improvement of the health of Nigerians and the Nigerian environment.

- iii) Guidelines for the Control of Public Health Pests and Vectors Infestation for Environmental Health Professionals in Nigeria; and
- iv) Standard Operational Guidelines on Premises Inspection and Certification
